#### This Month's Presentation:

"The Life of Sansevierias"

By: James Chambers

James' presentation will provide a perspective from the historical "roots" (pun intended!) of Sansevierias to how to properly care for them as house and/or outdoor plants, and he will also cover propagation techniques. He will present information that will likely surprise and contradict what you have previously thought about how to grow Sansevierias properly.

James Chambers has owned and operated Rocksmith Nursery in Valley Center for nearly 20 years and has been an avid plant grower for over 25 years. The nursery started out propagating rare palm trees from seed until the palm demand subsided from the recession and the drought around 2010. Since then James has focused on succulents but more on the rarer and uncommon species found in the Sansevieria, Agave, and Aloe families.

Rocksmith Nursery currently has a large cold frame filled with many rare and unusual varieties of Sansevierias with natural habitats ranging from South Africa to Ethiopia and India. Unlike the usual selection of Sansevieria trifasciata, commonly known as the "Snake Plant" or "Mother -in-law's



Tongue", the collection at Rocksmith Nursery focuses on all Sansevieria species, many that are rarely or never seen in cultivation. The various forms range from tall, thin and green wispy leaves, to super blue and very thick and rigid flat fans.

James has been married to Bethann, his wife of 28 years, and they have four young adult children.

James will be bringing about 50 plants to sell, so come early for the best selection!



~ Assist with plant identification






#### NEWS FROM THE SAFARI PARK GARDENS ~ BY JANET MORGAN

The volunteers have spent the beginning of 2018 examining and treating plants in the Safari Park Old World Garden (OWG) for aphids and aloe mites, planting new aloes, and weeding. Several large projects have been initiated this month as well. We're working with Jeff Moore to develop an Under Sea Garden (as opposed to an undersea garden, as the Park does not want the garden to be associated with any sea life). A designated space has been cleared of plants, and special top rocks and soil have been ordered. Soon the area will be planted with African succulents typical of an undersea succulent garden as well as some crested cactus and dudleya. A second project involves moving plants from the old greenhouse to the new greenhouse.

We'd like to thank Rick Bjorklund for his generous donation of several unusual aloes and an Uncarina roeoesliana from his collection.
