- Please bring your potluck goodies no later than 11:00 am. Remember to put your name on all serving dishes and utensils.



Christy Brenner spoke and showed slides about a monthlong trip to the Bolivian Andes. She talked about habitats on both sides of the Andes mountains: desert on the west side and lush jungle on the east side. Some of the habitats were at altitudes up to 15.000 feet.






Desert habitat adjacent to salt flats.








Map of Bolivia showing habitats west and east of the Andes. (Map not provided by Ms. Brenner.)

# El Cajon Library October Plant of the Month

## Melocactus matanzanus

*Melocactus matanzanus* is native to the northcentral area of Cuba. It is a popular and desirable species throughout the world as an ornamental plant. The common name for this cactus is "Turk's Cap," and the plant on display here belongs to Harold Dunn (thank you, Harold).

*Melocactus matanzanus* can reach a height of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches as well as a diameter of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches. There usually are at least 8 ribs, and the thorns are brownish-gray or white. The central spine is up to 2 inches long and the 5 to 8 radial spines are  $1\frac{1}{4}$  to 2 inches long.

When the plant reaches maturity, a cephalium grows on top, a globose structure covered with reddish-brown bristles (picture at right). The cephalium can be



up to  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inches tall by  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches in diameter, and is where the flowers (left picture below), fruits (middle picture below), and seed pods (right picture below) will form. The flowers are carmine and can be up to 2 inches long.
